Spring semester checklist:

- Study hard and do well in school - from now on your grades will count toward college! **IMPORTANT** - your junior year transcript will be used for college applications, you have 3 years to get your goal GPA to get into your dream college!
- Take the TSI. The TSI Assessment (TSIA) is part of the Texas Success Initiative program designed to help your college or university determine if you are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. If you are an incoming college student in Texas, you are required to take the TSI Assessment - unless you are already exempt (read below) - to determine your readiness for college-level work. Based on how you perform, you may either be enrolled in a college-level course and/or be placed in the appropriate developmental course or intervention to improve your skills and prepare you for success in college-level courses.

Senior Year

Fall semester checklist:

- Visit the YISD Scholarships page to see scholarships available for each month.

- Review your class schedule with your counselor to ensure you have met all college-preparatory requirements.

- Take the SAT or ACT tests again in September or October.

- Finalize your college & scholarship application essays.

- Visit Counselor for advice on Military Service and to take ASVAB.

- Attend college presentations.

- Establish your game plan for submitting applications, consider local schools such as UTEP and EPCC to have enough options to choose from.

- Begin the college application process in September.

- Apply to minimum of 3 schools to receive more options and have more choices.

- Apply directly to the college/university you are interested in.

- Be sure to submit any fees or fee waivers for the admissions applications that you submit.

- By October 1st, obtain your FSA ID for you and your parents. After October 1st submit the Free Application for Student Financial Aid (FAFSA) to the schools you are applying to.

- Download the FAFSA app (myStudentAid) on your phone and submit your FAFSA to get updates on the status.
