Voya Unsung Heroes Awards Program

Do you have an innovative teaching method or creative educational project that can positively influence students? Are you an educator with a class project that is short on funding and long on potential? Do you know a teacher looking for grant dollars? Voya Unsung Heroes can help turn great ideas into reality for students.

All awards must be used to further the projects as described in your submitted application. Voya will award 50 finalists \$2,000 each. Of the 50 finalists, three will be selected for additional financial awards. First place will receive a bonus of \$25,000; second place will receive a bonus of \$10,000, and third place will receive a bonus of \$5,000. Award checks will be made payable jointly to the recipient and to their school. The funds will be placed into a school account for the awarded teacher to use.

Applicants must be:

- Employed by an accredited K-12 public or private school located in the U.S.
- Full-time educators, teachers, principals, paraprofessionals, or classified staff with **effective and innovative projects that improve student learning.**

Helpful Tips for Writing a Foundation Grant

Simplify

You can spend time writing a grant proposal, but it will be time wasted if the reviewer can't understand it. Simplify your writing using these tips:

- Don't use vague words and empty phrases Ex: nearly, almost, about, or roughly.
- Don't use jargon, technical language, acronyms, or clichés.
- Don't use words you wouldn't normally use on a daily basis.
- Use common words, short sentences, and short paragraphs to help readers follow along and to stay engaged.
- Use charts and graphs to explain your points this gives the reader a break in reading text.
- Use headings and subheadings to control the flow of the application.

Useful Steps for Successful District Routing

All grant and project applications, regardless of the dollar amount, must be routed through the central office administrative approval process.

- **Step 1:** Write the application and follow the required steps to complete the application. Do NOT submit it to the funder.
- **Step 2:** Print a copy of the application. Ensure the full narrative is visible. If unable to expand the response boxes, include a Word document with full responses.
- Step 3: Complete and sign the <u>YISD Campus Grant Submission Form</u> and have your principal sign too.
- **Step 4:** To start the district routing approval process, scan and email the completed application and the signed Campus Grant Submission Form to lcuster@yisd.net in the Office of Competitive Grants (OCG).
- **Step 5:** Allow up to 5 business days for the routing process to be completed. Several central office departments may be involved in this approval process.
- **Step 6:** Once the application has been approved, the OCG will notify you to submit the grant or project application to the funder.
- **Step 7:** Notify the OCG once your project has been funded.
