- Purchase books, materials, or software for literacy programs

Whole Kids Foundation Garden Grant Program

Kids who grow veggies, eat veggies, so school gardens can make a big difference. Through the Garden Grant program, schools and non-profit organizations turn outdoor spaces into powerful hands-on learning gardens that connect kids with food, spark their curiosity, and support classroom curriculum. The Garden Grant program supports a new or existing edible educational garden. The edible garden must engage at least 10 children, in any grades K-12, on a regular basis. This grant requires a community partner (e.g., local non-profit, local farm, hardware or garden store, garden club, restaurant). The partner may provide volunteer support, donations, free garden consultations.

Helpful Tips on Writing a Foundation Grant

Be direct and concise

- Use clear and straight forward language
- Eliminate unnecessary phrases and redundancies

Check your spelling and punctuation

- Check your spelling, grammar, and punctuation
- Have someone else check it, too

A mistake that you miss, may be found by the grant reviewer or the prospective funder. Put your best foot forward and let your ideas get all the attention.

Steps for District Routing

All grant and project applications, regardless of the dollar amount, must be routed through the central office administrative approval process using the following steps.

- 1. Write the application and follow the required steps to complete the application. Do NOT submit it to the funder yet.
- 2. Print a copy of the completed application. Ensure each narrative response is fully visible. If unable to expand any of the response boxes, save the question(s) and full response(s) in a Word document.
- 3. Complete and sign the YISD Campus Grant Submission Form and have your principal sign too.
- 4. To start the district routing approval process, scan and email the following documents to lcuster@yisd.net in the Office of Competitive Grants (OCG):
 - a. Completed application
 - b. Saved Word response(s), if necessary
 - c. Signed Campus Grant Submission Form
- 5. Allow up to 7 business days for the routing process to be completed. Several central office departments may be involved in this approval process.
- 6. Once the application has been approved, the OCG will notify you to submit the grant or project application to the funder.
- 7. Notify the OCG once your project has been funded.
