Society for Science STEM Research Grants

STEM Research Grants provide support to full-time middle school and high school teachers who are engaging students in authentic scientific research projects beyond what might normally be done in a classroom, including science fair projects and similar competitions. Priority consideration is given to schools that support students from low-income communities and demographics underrepresented in STEM fields.

Grant opportunities:

- Up to \$5,000 to purchase specialized equipment needed for student research; OR
- Preselected equipment valued at \$1,000, described in the FAQs at: https://www.societyforscience.org/outreach-and-equity/stem-research-grants/about/#what-equipment-is-in-the-kit-for-2023-2024

Applicants may apply for one or both of these. If awarded, it will only be for one or the other, not both. If you have previously received a Society for Science STEM Research Grant, you are eligible to apply again.

Oliver Foundation Healthy Choices Grants

The goal of the Oliver Foundation is to encourage children, families, and communities in Texas to improve the eating and physical activity patterns of Pre-school, Elementary, Middle, and High School students. Proposed programs may be provided by campus, grade level, teacher, or in the summer.

<u>Healthy Choices Grant Level 1</u> is for a single school year or a summer program and ranges from \$750 to \$3,000. Level 1 requires incorporation of at least three of seven Healthy Messages, including at least one physical and one nutritional activity.

<u>Healthy Choices Grant Level 2</u> is for two or more years and is intended to create a long-term sustainable program at the campus level. Level 2 grants range from \$3,000 to \$5,000. Level 2 requires incorporation of at least five of seven Healthy Messages, including at least one physical and one nutritional activity.

Healthy Messages: C Choose 5-A-Day servings of fruits & vegetables!

H Have more water & less sugary beverages!

O Opt for healthy snacks!

I Increase active play & decrease screen time!

C Choose 3-A-Day servings of low-fat dairy products!

E Enjoy a healthy breakfast!

Classroom Assistance Grants are awarded to Texas public school teachers who, on a daily basis, demonstrate commitment to public education and Texas children through the creation of programs, events, or other learning platforms. The Texas Retired Teachers Foundation will award \$1,000 grants to 30 public school teachers in Texas for the 2024-2025 school year. The funding should be used to go beyond the basic curriculum, bring creativity into the classroom, and support a learning objective(s).

Helpful Tips for Writing a Foundation Grant

- Read the grant instructions and application to ensure what you need aligns with the funder.
- Write your proposal with sufficient details to explain your project.
 - ° Discuss the need(s) your project will address, this may include a little bit of data
 - Describe your proposed solution to the need(s)
 - Use a little background and context to help the reader understand your project
 - Say what you need to say without being too wordy or flowery
 - Align the needs, the proposed project, and the planned budget

Steps for District Routing

All grant and project applications, regardless of the dollar amount, must be routed through the central office administrative approval process using the following steps.

- 1. Write the application and follow the required steps to complete the application. Do NOT submit it to the funder yet.
- 2. Print a copy of the completed application. Ensure each narrative response is fully visible. If unable to expand any of the response boxes, save the question(s) and full response(s) in a Word document.
- 3. Complete and sign the YISD Campus Grant Submission Form and have your principal sign too.
- 4. To start the district routing approval process, scan and email the following documents to lcuster@yisd.net in the Office of Competitive Grants (OCG):
 - a. Completed application
 - b. Saved Word response(s), if necessary
 - c. Signed Campus Grant Submission Form
- 5. Allow up to 7 business days for the routing process to be completed. Several central office departments may be involved in this approval process.
- 6. Once the application has been approved, the OCG will notify you to submit the grant or project application to the funding source.
- 7. Notify the OCG once your project has been funded.
