
What is Bullying?

Definition: Bullying occurs when a student or group of students engages in written or verbal expression, expression through electronic means, or physical conduct that occurs on school property, at a school-sponsored or school-related activity, or in a vehicle operated by the District and that:

1. Has the effect or will have the effect of physically harming a student, damaging a student's property, or placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to student's person or of damage to the student's property; or
2. Is sufficiently severe, persistent, and pervasive enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student.

This conduct is considered bullying if it:

1. Exploits an imbalance of power between the student perpetrator and the student victim through written or verbal expression or physical conduct; and
2. Interferes with a student's education or substantially disrupts the operation of a school. (FFI Local)

Bullying Acts:

- Hazing
- Threats of physical harm (threatening to beat someone up)
- Confinement
- Destruction of property
- Theft of valued possessions
- Rumor Spreading
- Ostracism
- Physical harassment (like pushing, shoving, punching, kicking, etc.)
- Harassment (name calling, racial comments, teasing and/or insults)
- Sexual Harassment (names, comments, and actions that have to do with sexual themes)
- Assault (beating someone up)
- Extortion (taking someone's money or items of value by force)

Retaliation:

The District prohibits retaliation by a student or District employee against any person who in good faith makes a report of bullying, serves as a witness, or participates in an investigation.
