Valle Verde Early College High School is committed to providing all students a combined high school and college experience by simultaneously earning a high school diploma and an Associate Degree from El Paso Community College.

VALLE VERDE EARLY COLLEGE HS is one of 52 campuses in Ysleta Independent School District. VALLE VERDE EARLY COLLEGE HS opened its doors in 2007 and serves predominantly economically disadvantaged, first generation college students. VALLE VERDE EARLY COLLEGE HS serves 371 students in grades 9 to 12. Five years ago, 403 students were served by the campus, which is a(n) Decrease of 22% %.

The student population is 0.81% African-American, 3.50% Anglo, 0.27% Asian, 95.15% Hispanic, 42.59% male and 57.41% female with a low socioeconomic status of 62.80%. The staff population is 0.00% African-American, 18.18% Anglo, 0.00% Asian, 81.82% Hispanic, 36.36% male and 63.64% female.

The drop-out rate of 0% % and the average daily attendance rate for students is 97.91%. The average daily attendance rate for campus personnel is 0.00. There were 26 discipline referrals this year.

VALLE VERDE EARLY COLLEGE HS serves 32 English Language Learner students, 82 students in the Gifted and Talented program, 12.13% males, 9.97% females, and 1.35% Language English Proficient students, 37 students identified for 504 services, 0 students in RTI, 8 students served through special education services with 1 % and 0 % students tested, but not qualified for special education services.

## Our Future

### **Strengths**

- Over 90% of our students qualify to take college classes at EPCC in all areas in order to earn 60 college hours and an Associate of Arts degree.
- All students take Pre-Advanced or Advanced placement courses and dual credit (when they qualify).
- 33 students are on track to become early graduates.
- Campus has a partnership with EPCC. The summer bridge camp is offered to all incoming freshmen to prepare for TSI exam and help students connect to both campuses.
- Campus offers a college transition course which teaches note taking, time management, study skills, self advocacy, and comprehension strategies to students (EDUC 1300).
- 100% of students pass EOC in Algebra I, Biology, and US History at the Approaches level. Over 97% of student pass the EOC in English 1 and 2 at the Approaches level.

#### Needs/Weaknesses

- VVECHS needs to improve the percent of students scoring Meets and Masters on End of Course exams.
- VVECHS needs to increase the percentage of students scoring a 3 or higher on Advanced Placement exams.
- VVECHS needs to increase the percentage of students meeting TSIA readiness standards their freshman year.
- VVECHS needs to maintain or go above 96% in attendance every week to include intersession and fall/spring break.
